	• Council updates BA provided a brief update. He noted that lack of grass cutting etc was a general concern, informing the group that due to financial pressures Kirklees staffing was reduced. He will provide further update at the next meeting.	RB/BA
	• Traffic Calming At the last meeting, NW had asked for volunteers to form a Task and Finish group to support this work. Despite ongoing concerns about traffic/speed in the village no one had come forward. Nick said that without this group it would not be possible to progress this work for the time being. 	NH-W reminded the meeting of the suggestions for improvements discussed with and being considered by the Kirklees Council representative which included new speed signs, moving signs, working with the school etc. Bill informed the group that moving	

	speed limit signs was not easy and was expensive for Kirklees so was unlikely to be approved.

	• Open Forum - what matters to you? JD asked why there was a skip next to the church. KH confirmed this was for the Eco group and was temporary whilst the churchyard was being cleared.	
	It was agreed by the group that there would be no December meeting and the focus should be on the AGM and quiz / pie and peas night as a fundraising event. There was little will in the committee to organise a December social given December 'business'.	
	Disappointment was expressed by a minority of attendees that there would not be a December 'social' and band as per previous years. Suggested that the Bowling Club could still run this event with FTCG support. Band had already been booked by the bowling club. Decision made by the bowling club to cancel.	
	The discussion was prompted by an announcement that the band needed to change the date from a Wednesday to a Tuesday which was not workable for some attendees.

	• Finance update In the absence of the Treasurer, the Chair gave a verbal update. There has been very little change in the financial position over the previous month with the exception of the Farnley Flutter prize. A full financial update will be given at the AGM on 6 November 2024.	
	• Community Fundraising Scheme The suggestion of commissioning village name markers to be placed at all entrances to the village was approved. It is hoped that these will remind drivers that they are in a residential area and be more aware of their speed.	
	• Continuation of Newsletter FH confirmed that she would produce one final newsletter in November. FH was thanked for all her work in producing the newsletter over the past 10 years.	
	NH-W asked what the demand was for hardcopy newsletter rather than electronic. The general feeling was that the hard copy was still appreciated by some members of the community.	
	DC offered to produce and print the newsletter provided he had support with the articles, news, stories etc. This was agreed with thanks.	
	• AGM NH-W confirmed that details of all the posts available would be circulated prior to the meeting. He confirmed that, if elected, he would serve for 1 further year before stepping down as chair.	
	NH-W has asked existing committee to consider their positions and think about creating space for new members.
